

COURSES

You should start here if you've already taken level 2 or have studied Spanish before and can comfortably conjugate verbs in the present tense.

Level 3 is a 10 session course that meets for 2 hours each week. There are 20 hours of instruction time.

You should only enter Level 3 if you can confidently answer the following questions:

- · ¿Qué prefieres hacer en tu tiempo libre?
- · ¿Qué tienes ganas de hacer este fin de semana?
- ¿Qué haces por la mañana antes de ir al trabajo?
- · Piénsalo bien. ¿Qué es lo que más te molesta?
- ¿Qué hiciste el fin de semana pasado?

- ¿Cómo eras cuando tenías 10 años?
- · ¿Has vivido en país hispanohablante?
- · ¿Qué has logrado hacer este año?

CLASSES	OBJECTIVES
CLASS 1 Introductions	You will be able to introduce yourself to your class in the present tense to review how you are, what you do and preferences.
CLASS 2 The Past	You will be able to use the preterite tense to talk about what you did the day before, over the weekend, and other past times.
CLASS 3 Vacations	You will be able to use the preterite tense to talk about what you did on your most recent vacation.
CLASS 4 Celebrations	You will be able to use the preterite tense to talk about the last party you attended, or about the last holiday you celebrated.
CLASS 5 Stages of Life	You will be able to use the imperfect tense to talk about your childhood or adolescent life.
CLASS 6 Anecdotes	You will be able to use the imperfect tense and the preterite tense to share personal anecdotes.
CLASS 7 Gossip	You will be able to use the imperfect tense and the preterite tense to understand and talk about Spanish gossip.
CLASS 8 Film & Literature	You will be able to use the imperfect and the preterite to talk about literature and film, in general, and recount what happened in the last book or film that you read or watched.
CLASS 9 Past Experiences	You will be able to use the present perfect tense to talk about past experiences, and about what you have or have not done in life.
CLASS 10 Accomplishments & Aspirations	You will be able to use the present perfect tense to talk about your accomplishments, aspirations and things you have never experienced before.

COURSE OUTLINE

CLASSES	OBJECTIVES
CLASS 1 Review	You will feel more comfortable using all of the past tenses that you have learned so far and be able to talk about various past events.
CLASS 2 The Future	You will learn how to use the future tense to talk about your future plans.
CLASS 3 Future Plans	You will be able to use the future tense to talk about your plans for the distant future including your bucket list and what you will be like in your old age.
CLASS 4 Dating	You will be able to use the conditional mood to talk about what you would or wouldn't do in the dating scene.
CLASS 5 Ideal Life	You will be able to use the conditional mood to describe what your ideal life would look like.
CLASS 6 Speculations	You will be able to use the future tense to make speculations about the people around you. You will also be able to use both the future and conditional to talk about life's possibilities and certainties.
CLASS 7 Wishes	You will be able to use the subjunctive mood to talk about your wishes and desires.
CLASS 8 Advice	You will be able to use the subjunctive in order to be able to give advice to your friends and family.
CLASS 9 Venting	You will be able to use the subjunctive in order to vent in Spanish.
CLASS 10 Politics	You will be able to use the subjunctive in order to give your opinions about politics.

LEVEL 3

In Level 3, you'll not only strengthen your vocabulary to be able to talk about a wide variety of topics, but also learn how to use different past tenses.

By the end of this level you will be able to answer the following questions:

- ¿Adónde fuiste para tus últimas vacaciones? ¿Qué hiciste?
- ¿Qué hiciste para celebrar la navidad el año pasado?
- ¿Cómo eras cuando tenías 10 años?
- ¿Has vivido en un país hispanohablante?
- ¿Qué has logrado hacer este año?

In Level 4, you'll not only gain the confidence to share your opinions across a wide variety of topics, but you will also learn the future tense, conditional mood, and subjunctive mood in order to have more engaging and meaningful conversations in Spanish.

By the end of this level you will be able to answer the following questions:

- ¿Qué harás en el próximo año?
- ¿Saldrías con alguien que conociste por internet?
- ¿Cómo sería tu vida ideal?
- ¿Qué hará tu mejor amigo/a ahora?
- ¿Cómo esperas que sea nuestro país en diez años?

When do your group courses meet?
